## BADMINTON England Update

The restructuring of BADMINTON England delivery we reported in our March newsletter is not going well - at least as far as London and Eastern Region, including Hertfordshire, is concerned. We believe we do not have a Regional Manager (Paul Bickerton has resigned since March); and recruitment for Participation Manager and Workforce Officers have not so far been successful. The only ray of light is Matthew Warren who has been confirmed as Partnership Manager and is also currently trying to fill the gaps as best he can. Thanks Matt!

**STOP PRESS:** We have just heard that Matthew Warren will be leaving us at the end of this month of July. We cannot thank and praise him enough for his help and support, particularly since Hertfordshire was left without a BDO even before the re-organisation at Head Office. We wish Matthew all the best in his new job in Cambridge.

The almost total lack of support from Head Office (we believe the Regional Team currently consists solely of one Participation Manager) places even more responsibility on volunteers if we are to have any chance of Hertfordshire receiving a share of BE funding. We desperately need more badminton players to volunteer and get involved through their local CBNs. (See the article on CBNs and funding.)

## HBA AGM

The HBA AGM was held on Tuesday 4 June 2013 at Birchwood Leisure Centre.

In addition to the now established tradition of refreshments (wine and nibbles), and the usual Reports on Activities, election of officers, President and Vice Presidents, and Presentation of Trophies to League winners, Matthew Warren (Eastern Region Partnership Manager) gave a presentation on the BADMINTON England Whole Sport Plan. Unfortunately we were subsequently denied permission to share the presentation on our website.

The big impact of BE's abolition of JJC status (Junior member of a Junior Club) was explained during the discussion on proposed County fees for the coming season, and the proposal accepted as follows: Senior fee unchanged at £3.70; Junior fee £1, with a 50% rebate to Junior clubs. . The meeting also approved the new Constitution.

It was a pity that the meeting was so poorly attended, and that even some clubs who had trophies to receive couldn't be bothered to turn up.

**REMINDER** Malcolm Fraser reminded us of the importance of the Sport England Activity survey results for continued funding, and urged everyone responding to these telephone questionnaires to stress that they played badminton regularly – and encourage any family and friends contacted for the survey to do so too!

### Herts Youth Games

## Community Fun

Following the success of the event last year, Welwyn Hatfield Council organised a Community Fun Day in April at Campus West. As the rooms were small, there was some very creative use of space, and none more so than badminton in the 8 foot high dance studio.

With new Level 1 coaches Beth Kirby and Nathan Schofield on hand to coach and organise, the activity proved very popular and great fun for a range of would-be players from a 4 year old hitting a balloon to



youngsters just hitting across the BISI nets to each other, and adults learning back-hand serves for the first time. With the range of ages and two nets in the limited space, Beth and Nathan were kept fully occupied from 11am to 4pm.

Taking badminton to the community in this way is the obvious next step after open days and taster session in sports centres. Recent "Taking badminton to shoppers" activities at the Galleria, for example, have also been successful – and led new potential members to clubs local to them.

We need to increase participation – more club members as well as more regular casual players - if we are to keep the current level of Sport England funding to BADMINTON England and ultimately to us in Hertfordshire. ## HSBA Awards

Every year HSBA ask for nominations from HSBA and HBA committee member, as well as coaches and clubs, for a Young Coach of the Year and a Young Administrator of the Year. Both nominees must be aged 21 or under by April 30<sup>th</sup> 2013.

Beth Kirby and Nathan Scofield, who obtained their Level 1 qualification early this year, were both nominated for Coach of the Year. Both were long-standing junior members of Comets JBC, and after progressing to senior clubs continued to attend junior

club sessions as helpers and later as Level 1 coaches. They both proved their value as thoughtful and insightful coaches, as well as their loyalty and dependability - often turning up at 6pm for club sessions after a full day of playing and other commitments!

As HSBA had received no Administrator nomination, and preferred not to "split" the Coach Award, it was decided to give the Coach Award to Nathan, and the Administrator Award to Beth, who in addition to her

coaching had also given much of her time and talents to administration while helping at tournaments and other event.

## Thanks and Good Wishes

It is with regret that we have to report the end of an era, with the retirement of Pam and Fred Chinnery, and the closure of their junior badminton club after more than forty years.

Fred himself has a long badminton history as player and coach. He first played badminton in Middlesex around 1945, organising teams to play in the local works leagues. About the same time as he was selected to play for the Middlesex County team he decided to qualify as a coach.

He moved to Stevenage New Town in 1955, to find there were few organised sports clubs in this part of Hertfordshire. So he persuaded the management of British Visqueen to mark out a badminton court in the middle of their spacious

factory. He started a badminton club there, and (with others) created the Stevenage Works league. At this time he also played for Herts County team, was elected to the HBA committee where he became a County Selector, eventually being elected President.

His influence on junior badminton opportunities, particularly in the 70's, was similarly far-reaching. With Malcolm Fraser, Fred was instrumental in forming the Herts Schools Badminton Association, and was elected coach and selector to the Herts County Junior team. Malcolm and Fred spent many Sundays transporting the team to matches throughout the Eastern region, and Fred later became selector for the Eastern Region Junior team.

It was while he was injured and unable to play that Fred decided to coach full time in local secondary schools. He realised keen and talented youngsters were not being accepted by local adult clubs. So he began a coaching club for youngsters 6-18 years old at John Henry Newman school. In this venture he was ably helped by Pam, his wife, who undertook many of the administrative tasks, including their successful application for Premier Club status. When Shephall Sports Hall opened the club moved there, becoming known as SCOB (Stevenage Centre of Badminton Excellence) under leadership of Fred and Pam's son, Bruce, but with Fred retaining an active interest and Pam continuing with admin.

Fred was presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his service to badminton over so many years, but his true reward and legacy are the many players he coached, some

of whom played for the County or for their University, and many of whom are still playing in local clubs.

## Center Parcs Schools Championships

Unfortunately the Verulam **U16 Boys** team of Daniel Fox, Harry Kuill-Jones, Pavitar Singh and Charlie Holmes, and the Presdales **U16 girls** team of Kate Hill, Mollie Georgina Graham, Charlotte Clarke & Eloise Tarry did not get through the Regional Finals played in Cambridge at the end of March.

However, both Herts U14 teams successfully won through to the finals at Center Parcs Sherwood Forest in April.

The sun was shining on the weekend of 20/21 April, but the main action was indoors as 36 teams from secondary schools across England battled to become the 2013 National Schools' Badminton Champions at U14 and U16 age groups.

The two U14 teams representing Eastern Region were the Monks Walk (Welwyn Garden City) team of Chris Adey, Jack Kimber, Matthew Harden, Nima Karshenas and Calum Wilson, and the St Clement Danes' (Chorleywood) team of Ellen Jennings, April Miller, Ashley Eales and Olive Coles.

There were nine schools in each of the U14 categories. These were seeded and split into three groups of three for Round 1. The results of Round 1 determined the groupings for the next round, in which schools competed for the final placings.

### U14 Boys' Event

After a great start Monk's Walk suffered a 5-0 defeat by Trentham High School from Staffordshire. Given that this team consisted of five county players, led by England player, Jack Buckley, the team were not too disheartened and were delighted to finish second in their box, putting them in the play-offs for positions 4-6.

In Round 2, Monk's Walk lost 4-1 to Bournemouth Collegiate after some close, hard-fought games. Finally, they faced Tapton School from Yorkshire. A win would secure fifth place. Hopes were high after Chris Adey won his singles. Tapton evened the score with a doubles win against Matthew Harden and Nima Karshenas. In the second singles match, Jack Kimber and his opponent were very evenly matched but the Yorkshire boy closed out the match at 21-18. Chris Adey and Matthew Harden won their doubles to make it two games all, but Tapton won the deciding game, leaving Monk's Walk in sixth place overall.

Trentham High School won the boys' event to become U14 Boys National Champions after a nail-biting final against Denbigh School from Milton Keynes.

### U14 Girls' Event

St Clement Danes found itself playing North London Collegiate School headed up by a name familiar in junior badminton circles - Keya Patani. So the first game on was quite poignant from a Herts' perspective - Ellen Jennings v Keya Patani. It was a real nail-biter with Ellen squeaking a 21-20 win. The final score was 5-0 to SCD but it was a tougher match than the score suggests.

Next up was Upton-by-Chester, definitely the seeds in the box. Upton-by-Chester school shares sports facilities with the West Cheshire Performance Centre and all 4 girls in the school team train there. In fact they had the top 3 U15 Cheshire girls plus another U15 county player - strength in spades! St Clement Danes were overpowered, with the only win being Ellen Jennings at No 1 singles with another 21-20 nail-biter.

So SCD finished 2nd in the box leaving them in play-offs for positions 4-6 against Minster and Guildford High. The Minster match was pretty frustrating as the whole match was decided by a 21-20 defeat in the last game. The match against Guildford High School, spearheaded by Samodani Weijjtunge (the No 1 U15 girl in England), was tougher. April picked up No 2 singles and No 2 doubles with Olive but Ellen and Ashley could not totally cut Samodani out of the doubles (although they had a good try!) and so lost 21-19 making it a 3-2 win to Guildford. The final position for St Clement Danes was a creditable 6th.

Upton-by-Chester won the girls' event, dropping just 2 games all day.

In between matches, players had the opportunity to meet and chat to special guests ex-GB internationals Nathan Robertson and Gail Emms as well as rising GB star Rhys Walker. This event is a lot of fun and a real eye-opener for less experienced players.

## DEVELOPMENT

### Money for Your Club!

Current re-organisation means funding is available for clubs through your local CBN.

**Community Badminton Networks (CBNs)** are open to organisations and individuals who are passionate about or just involved in badminton opportunities. Ideally a CBN meeting would be attended by representatives of local authority sports officers, badminton facilities, local schools, local clubs, CBN officers, coaches - anyone who wants to help develop badminton in the area, or wants help to develop their own badminton projects.

As explained in our March newsletter, one of the results of the Head Office restructuring is that basic development of our beloved game (apart from elite level) will depend almost entirely upon the efforts of County and local organisations to obtain funding through their CBNs (Community Badminton Networks). Funding from Head Office is available – provided the CBN produces a development plan which is approved by the Regional Team Manager and/or Head Office.

Welwyn Hatfield and West Herts are two CBNs which have been chosen to pilot this programme before it is due to start nationally (in September, we believe). Both WHCBN and West Herts CBN are currently preparing their development plans, mainly with input from those organisations who attend their meetings. At the moment these draft plans include ideas to develop a workforce of coaches, young Leaders and Apprentices in schools, volunteer Activators in University and Colleges.

### **STOP PRESS: CBN plans now needed by all 4 CBNs by 31 July to secure their funding.**

Because BE funding depends upon increasing weekly participation (as measured in Sport England Active People telephone surveys), plans also include promotion of Smash Up in secondary schools, No Strings, No Strings Essentials, facility-run weekly sessions, and taking badminton into the community – for example into shopping centres or community events.

If your club wants to develop, contact your CBN now to discuss your needs. Even better, if you can see opportunities to increase participation in your area - regular social players may go on to join a local club, for example - please get in touch or attend the occasional meeting to share your ideas. **Everyone is welcome!
