### National schools tournament

The Hertfordshire County round of the tournament was held at Hertfordshire Sports Village on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> December, with girls' and boys' events for the Under 14 and Under 16 age groups. Competing in each were 10 teams who had won the right to represent their district following local competitions held within districts. The format of each event provided all-play-all matches in two groups of five teams, followed by head-to-head encounters between the first and second-placed teams in each group to determine the top four teams.

In each age group the winners of the nine regional events then compete at the grand finals at the National Badminton Centre, Milton Keynes on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> April.

### **First match day for the Hertfordshire Junior Badminton League**

The League is an innovation this season that provides for players who are not members of the County squad but are keen to gain experience of competitive badminton to represent their district in matches against teams from the other districts in the County. A Team Manager for each district selects players for their team: most players are members of junior badminton clubs in Hertfordshire, but not all are, and the League aims to cast its net widely in the search for youngsters with skills in the game and a strong competitive drive.

Thus it was that teams from all ten Hertfordshire districts met at Birchwood Leisure Centre in Hatfield on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> November to play their first three matches of the season. There are two more match days, and by the end of them each district team will have played a match against each of the other nine. Matches comprise a game in each of the five disciplines (girls' and boys' singles, girls' and boys' doubles and mixed doubles), played to 21 points or for a maximum of 7 minutes. It may sound complicated but thanks to the commitment of the Team Managers and the organisational ability of Barbara Lewczynska and Beverley Stobo who ran the results desk, the day passed off without a hitch. (I was quite good at blowing the whistle too!)

The competition was intense throughout four hours of non-stop play, with the large contingent of parents and supporters contributing to the excitement of the atmosphere. Most matches were closely-fought, though the two teams which were each short of one player were severely handicapped by having to concede one game 0-21 in

their matches. The Hertsmere team was the only one to win all its matches, with especially strong performances from the singles players, but because league positions are determined by points scored and conceded, not by matches won and lost, it is not they but Welwyn Hatfield and then Three Rivers who currently lead the table. Are we seeing in these three outfits the league's strongest teams emerging? Were the matches between Hertsmere and Welwyn Hatfield and between Hertsmere and Three Rivers, which both finished narrowly in favour of Hertsmere, really top-of-the-table clashes? Or do the vagaries of the fixture list make it impossible to identify the pace-setters this early in the season? Certainly there is everything to play for on the remaining match days which are at Birchwood Leisure Centre, Hatfield on 14<sup>th</sup> February and 8<sup>th</sup> May.

At the end of the season's competition a team of players who have performed best in League matches will be selected to represent the Hertfordshire League in the National Inter-League Finals to be held at the National Badminton Centre in Milton Keynes on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> June 2016.

### HSBA Tournament November 15<sup>th</sup>

The day kicked off with the Under 13 Boys' B singles followed by the Under 13 Girls' B singles at 12.00 hours. In these events there happened to be perfect numbers, 16 in the boys' and 8 in the girls'. As usual there were main and plate competitions in both events.

We had a wide range of school entries, with Haberdashers' Aske's Boys making up the largest contingent, with a smattering from Queen Elizabeth Boys, Bishops Stortford College and Hitchin Boys, to name but a few. James Joseph (Alban Wood JMI), won the main competition with a 15-12 victory in the final over Will Davis (Hitchin Boys), and in the plate competition Aseem Ketkar (Haberdashers' Aske's Boys) beat Sai Bodanapu (Queen Elizabeth Boys) 15-11. The girls' competition, a perfect eight, had two boxes of four with everyone proceeding to a semi-final in round two. The eventual final in the main competition, between two St Helens school competitors, resulted in a close 15-12 victory for Emily Cawthorne over Alyssa Gower – I am sure there were no hard feelings! In the plate competition, Bethan Athill (Monks Walk) beat Ziyu Zhao (St Albans High School) in a tightly contested game by 15-14.

Just as the singles ended the Under 11 Doubles competitors started to arrive. There was some great play throughout the afternoon, with twelve pairs of boys and seven pairs of girls. The girls played in one box of seven, so every pair had six games. Because it was a round robin there was no final and the winners were the pair that won the most games. The final results were as follows:

- 1st place - Leona Lee and Lavigne Leung (Stonehill/St Albans High School)
- 2nd place – Pranathi Koneru and Mabel Reid (Gravelly Primary/Heath Mount)
- 3rd place – Maia di Gesaro and Deborah James (Heath Mount/Our Lady WGC)

In the boy's competition, there were lots of mixing of County players in pairings with non-County players, so we knew it was going to be an interesting competition! In the main event the final was won by Ben Herbert and Cameron Sharkey (Aldwickbury/Templewood), with the runners-up Finley Goode and Jake Watkiss (Templewood/Kimpton), and in the plate event Ben Davison and Reuben de Villiers (Applecroft) beat Thomas Rock and Ben Gostick (St Johns Baldock/Templewood).
