Center Parcs National Schools Championships 2014/15

Entries are now being accepted from schools right across England for the 2014/15 Center Parcs National Schools Badminton championships. Girls' and boys' events are being run for Key Stage 3 and 4 schoolchildren.

Entry is simple: the only information schools need to provide is the number of teams being entered by age group and gender. The deadline for entry is **Friday 17 October**, and the entry form is available at:

The Hertfordshire county round for this season's championships will be held on Tuesday 2 December at Hertfordshire Sports Village. Before this date, districts will hold their own tournaments as necessary to identify the boys' and the girls' teams to represent them at KS3 and KS4 in the county round.

Winners of the county round in each event of the championships will then contest the regional round. The regional round will be held between 28 February and 26 March 2015, and further information about it will be provided at the County round.

The culmination of the championships is the national finals which will be held at Center Parcs, Sherwood Forest on dates in May 2015 which are shortly to be confirmed.

Hertfordshire schools delivered some fantastic performances in the 2013/14 competition, the highlight being the performance of the Monks Walk, Welwyn Garden City boys' KS3 team in winning the bronze medal at the national finals, so we hope for a strong entry from the County's schools in this year's competition.

HSBA tournaments

Herts Youth Games 2014

This year's Games were held at Wodson Park, Ware, on July 6th. With the continuing difficulties in funding for some local authorities, the tally of teams had shrunk to eight instead of ten, with Three Rivers and Welwyn Hatfield having to withdraw from the event. However there was still a great turnout with lots of parental support for all the teams, so the hall seemed as busy as it had been last year.

Accolades must go to the coaches who (from the standard of play) had clearly been working very hard with all their team members. They were:

Broxbourne – Geoff & Caz Daniels Dacorum – James Sweetnam East Herts – Doug Clarke & Vic Large Hertsmere – Alan Overy North Herts – Mathew Pocock St Albans – Keith Burns & Ben Chai Stevenage – Ben Vranjkovic Watford – Phil Adams The tournament followed the same round robin format as last year, with all teams playing each other and each match consisting of a boys' and girls' singles, a boys' and girls' doubles and a mixed doubles. Games were five minutes each (or the first to win), and there was the usual swap around of courts after each match.

During the first two rounds things were pretty evens stevens, but by the third round it was becoming apparent that one team, Watford, was doing particularly well and was out in front whilst there was a bit of a tussle going on between those teams in second third and fourth positions, and it was like that for the rest of the tournament. Since the final placings were calculated on points difference, it was important for every team to score the maximum number of points, even in the games they were losing.

After a very enjoyable few hours, in which I witnessed great sportsmanship and team spirit, the final placings were as follows:-

- 1. Watford
- 2. North Herts
- 3. Broxbourne
- 4. Stevenage
- 5. East Herts
- 6. Hertsmere
- 7. St. Albans
- 8. Dacorum

Some statistics: out of a maximum possible score of 525 points, all teams achieved over half, with the winners Watford managing to achieve a whopping 497. There was only a 32 points difference between Broxbourne, Stevenage and East Herts, so their placings could have been very different. Dacorum, who had to forfeit a game in every match because of a missing player, still managed to notch up 261 points – a great result.

HSBA September 20th 2014

A tip-top one hundred entrants graced the first HSBA tournament of the season. It was probably a little too early in the season to catch the schools' entrants, but Badminton England had pronounced this a 'junior county restricted weekend' somewhat late in last season and we had to postpone our proposed Under 15 open tournament, and so were left with a Stevenage booking which we had to honour. However it turned out to be a well-supported tournament, and my thanks go to Mike Newlove, Helena Lewczynska, Sue Clarke, Ronni Goode and all the other parents who so kindly took to the courts to referee when asked.

The Under 15 and Under 11 boys' singles were the first to take to the floor. There were seven boxes in the Under 15 event, all of which were closely fought. Steven Elliott took the singles title in the main event, with a victory over Luke Meehan by 21-13, and in the plate Harry Goode claimed a victory over Sonny Ward. Whilst there were fewer entrants in the Under 11 singles, we still managed to squeeze out a main and plate event. Jack Teoh had an excellent run to the final with an eventual win over Harry Searle, and in the plate, Finley Goode kept the family name way up on the badminton agenda with a victory over Fred Constantine. Mention must be made of Jaxon Clarke, who barely reached the bottom of the badminton net and yet managed to win a game in his box to qualify for the semi-finals of the plate. I think we may well be seeing a lot more of this young man. Well done Jaxon!!

The girls were lucky to have a lie-in, unless of course they had a brother competing earlier on. The Under 15 girl's singles played in three boxes, with Laura Anderson coming out tops in the main event and Olivia Clarke just pipping Amelia Dixon to the post in a tightly fought plate final by 21-19.

The Under 11 girls' singles, with ten participants, was also played in three boxes. There was a great display of badminton from these girls, some of them still in Year 4. The Lee sisters Leona and Alyssa fought it out in a very tight main event final, with Alyssa just swinging in at 21-19 (sister Leona won the title last year), and in the plate final, Pranathi Koneru pipped Maia Di Gesaro to the post by 21-14.

Doubles events started at about 13.30 hours, as most people playing in the singles were also playing in the doubles and we were able to get a head start on these events. The girls' doubles consisted of one box of five. The outright winners were Molly Goode and Abbie Smith and runners-up were Harriet Bell and Olivia Clarke; however there was a three way tie for third place, all three pairs having won two games apiece, and we had to

take points won as the next criteria. There were only five points between all three pairs, but there can only be one set of bronze medallists and the winning pair proved to be Amelia Dixon and Eleanor McArdle.

In the boys event there were enough pairs for a main and plate event. Chris Adey and Brendan Ho beat Rees Clarke and Luke Meehan in the main event final, whilst the plate event was won by Toby Goddard and Harry Goode, with a victory over Sam Jarman and Levin Mathew.

The Under 15 Mixed doubles event was resurrected after a three year sabbatical, and attracted five pairs. A special mention must go to Pranathi Koneru who at nine years old very kindly agreed to partner Shashank Madhukiran in the mixed event (and they didn't do badly either!!)

Entry fees to tournaments sanctioned by Badminton England

For this season BE have made some changes to the pricing of tournaments. Mike Newlove, the HSBA Tournament Manager, explains: "Previously the payment tournament managers made to BE was entirely hidden in an overall fee for tournament entry, but now BE have asked for their additional fee of £2.50 to be shown separately on entry forms. Most counties are complying with this request, but if you find a tournament whose entry form does not show the £2.50 surcharge, it doesn't mean you're not paying it – just that the tournament manager has chosen to hide it in their overall entry fee."

BE have also stopped prescribing the entry fee for their Gold, Silver and Bronze events. Mike comments: "You may see some variation in the entry fees now; for instance, a county which owns the venue for its tournament, as Middlesex BA owns the Hounslow Dome, may be able to charge less than those which have to book courts in public sports centres, as the majority do."

Even with this scope for variability, a quick trawl through a sample of this season's entry forms by your correspondent reveals that the fees for most have risen significantly, but maybe using on-line entry instead of posting a letter to a tournament organiser (sometimes with a self-addressed stamped envelope for the reply as well!) makes it all worthwhile for those who are used to doing their banking electronically.
